

Greetings All,

WOW!!! What in interesting month it has been. I hope that everyone is staying safe during this time of uncertainty with the Coronavirus. We are living through, what I believe, are historic times. I don't recall any time in my 50+ years where we have had such a long-term closure of so many things. I know that some of you are older than me and may have other experiences....

First, and foremost, I hope and pray that everyone is safe, healthy, and doing well. The council has attempted to call most of you this past week to check-in and make sure that everyone is OK. However, if you do need anything, if someone is sick, in the hospital, having problems, ANYTHING...please call the church office and leave a message.

Second. The church building is effectively "closed" for the short-term. Monica is checking mail and phone messages daily, but there are no office hours and all activities have been cancelled. This includes ALL church services including Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter. All gatherings in our church are cancelled (meetings, Weddings, Girl Scouts, TOPS, etc.). Additionally, as-of right now, I will assume that our April Congregational meeting will be postponed to a later date. We are hoping to resume somewhat normal schedules and operations the week of April 19th, but that will likely change depending on the current orders from the government.

Third, we are trying to produce videos for each week to be played through Facebook. The first one was a live-stream on March 22nd. Future videos will be pre-recorded and put on Facebook sometime on Saturday night or Sunday morning each week for you to watch. Even though we are not physically present with one another on Sunday mornings, be assured that Pastor Tim and each of us are thinking of you as we record these messages. As I mentioned in our live-stream, the following are some thoughts on "How to Attend Church Online".

- 1.) Get out of bed and get dressed, it will put you in the right mindset for worship.
- 2.) Go through your normal Sunday routine, minus the 'Hurry up, we're late' part.
- 3.) Gather together as a family. No multitasking; worship is a family activity.
- 4.) Watch on your largest screen if possible, it will feel more like you are really there.
- 5.) Sing along loud and proud. It may feel weird, but it also feels weird to the people making the video.
- 6.) Preach with the Preacher. Say "Amen", clap, shout and take notes. Have a time of prayer at the end.

Lastly, and this is the part that I hate, don't forget your church financially. During times like these, offerings will tend to drop off...but our expenses don't. We still have bills to pay, salaries, insurance, etc. You can mail a check or set-up an electronic payment through your bank...(please do not mail cash).

The weather is warming-up. Take a few minutes to go outside and get some fresh air (while maintaining social distancing). Go for a walk...be thankful for what you have...call your friends and family to check on them...talk to your neighbors from a safe distance. But rest-assured, when this is all over, we will once again gather to worship God and his Glory.

<u>Holy Week at Home for Friedens UCC</u>



In these times of shelter in place, we continue to find ways to connect with each other and worship as a community through live-streaming and videos of our services. This week is an important week for the church beginning with Palm and Passion Sunday, Maundy Thursday Service, Good Friday Service and Stations of the Cross, and Easter Sunday. I have included some information that may help you enter into this week as fully as you can from home. If you have any questions or want to be sure that you are included in the home deliveries, be sure to call or email the church office.



Palm Sunday/Passion Sunday Service:

(This day we experience the joyous demonstration of loyalty to Jesus as he enters Jerusalem by the crowds and we also experience the passion and suffering of our Lord through betrayal, denial, abandonment by the very people who proclaimed him King).

- 1. Palms will be delivered to the front house door of as many of our church community as possible. There are instructions included in this newsletter for the folding of the palm for the children and will be a part of our Children's Moment on Palm Sunday morning. Be sure you have your palm/palms with you for the Sunday Service.
- 2. We invite you to gather grape juice or wine and bread from your kitchen and place it on a table in the dining room or living room for your family as we will be inviting you to take communion with us on Palm Sunday morning as well.



Maundy Thursday Service:

(This is the night when Jesus shares his Last Supper and the words of institution that have become sacrament with the disciples before his crucifixion. This is also when Jesus washes the disciples' feet. Foot washing is the symbol of the servanthood of Jesus, both on the night before his death and in his continued presence in our midst).

1. You can prepare yourself and your family for this service by gathering Bibles, towels and/or washcloths and a basin or bucket of warm water and some hand sanitizer. You should find a place that is quiet where you and your family can sit comfortably. When the time comes, you may take turns washing each other's feet or you may choose to take a washcloth and wash each other's hands. Please note that if anyone is sick, they should not participate. Following the washing, you should all use hand sanitizer on your hands as a precautionary measure.



Good Friday and Stations of the Cross Service:

(This service is a way for us to enter into the passion of our Lord. We will be following the steps of our Lord as he makes his way to the cross and eventually his body to the tomb. You are invited to hear the reflection, scripture, and prayer at each station with quiet contemplation of the Holy Week experience of our Lord).

1. You can prepare yourself and your family by gathering Bibles in a quiet place. Church members (by video) will offer reflections, scripture, and prayer at each of the stations. At one point you are invited to pray the Lord's Prayer with us as one community.



Easter Sunday Service:

(This begins at Sunset on Holy Saturday and continues to Pentecost Sunday. It is the most important day of the Christian Year celebrating Christ's resurrection, ascension, and giving of the Holy Spirit on Easter Sunday! Because he lives, we live! Christ is Risen, He is Risen indeed!).

- 1. Several days before Easter another sack will be delivered to your front house door with sealed and prefilled elements of juice and wafer for our communion service at the Easter Sunday Service. If you don't receive enough, please gather your own communion supplies so that everyone can participate. There may be a few goodies in the bag for the children as well :
- 2. At 8 am Easter morning, you are invited to an early morning optional ritual with your family. I am inviting you to go outside on your front or back porch or driveway and either say the words from the Easter hymn, "Christ the Lord is risen today, Allelujah!" or for those who love to sing, actually sing the hymn to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord!

3. When you do tune in for Easter morning service, have your communion elements with you.

Directions on how to fold a palm into a cross!

HOW TO FOLD THE PALMS FROM CHURCH, INTO A CROSS:

Every Palm Sunday when they would give out Palm branches (fronds) at church - I used to marvel at the people that could quickly fold their palm branch into a cross! Eventually I figured out how to do the palm folding - and I was astounded at how easy it was. Don't be intimidated by the steps, they go very quickly and once your hands get used to the motion it's a 3-minute process! The following post will take you step by step through the process, easy peasy! Folding a palm branch into a cross can be a beautiful decoration for Easter, or all year long. Here's how to do it...

- Step 1: First, hold the palm branch in your hand, pointy side of the branch facing side up.
- Step 2: Fold the blade at a 90-degree angle, to the right.
- Step 3: Hold the fold down, you will see it creates a triangle. Now fold that triangle down.
- Step 4: Fold again. You will now see a small square where the triangle was.
- Step 5: Push the pointy end around the back of the square, and fold over so the pointy end is now facing left.
- Step 6: Take the pointy end and loop it towards you, then push the pointy end through the square until it comes out the other side.
- Step 7: Pull it all the way through.
- Step 8: Gently tug on both sides until it is locked in position.
- Step 9: Loop the pointy end towards yourself and push through the square.
- Step 10: You just made the top of your cross.
- Step 11: Turn your branch 45 degrees so that the pointy end is now facing downward, and the fat end is facing to the right.
- Step 12: Now flip the branch so that the fat end is now on your left (pointy side is still down).
- Step 13: Take the fat end of the branch and loop it towards you into the square.
- Step 14: Pull it until it reaches about the same length as the head you previously made.
- Step 15: Now, turn your branch over so that the straight fat end faces left once more.
- Step 16: Last, take the fat end and loop it towards you back into the square, until it's about the same length as the other two parts. Tuck it into the square and you're done!


