That seems to be the question on everyone's mind. It is on my mind too. There are several things to consider before we open our sanctuary for services again. Although the State has loosened the guidelines, they are still recommending either on-line services or other social distancing options. Additionally, the Illinois South Conference as well as our insurance carrier is cautioning churches about opening too soon. If we don't have the proper protocols and practices in place, and someone who attends our services becomes infected with the Covid-19 virus, they could hold us responsible. Above all else, I want to make sure that we keep our congregants safe. I would HATE to see anyone become infected and suffer health issues... or worse.

Unfortunately, we cannot allow outside organizations to utilize our building for the time being. This is again for some of the same reasons stated above. Also, although Doug is doing a great job in cleaning in our time without a full-time custodian, I don't expect him to have to sanitize our facilities after each group uses our building. This includes outside civic organizations as well as scheduled weddings, funerals, or other events that would rent our fellowship hall.

Now, on a lighter note...the hardwood floors in the sanctuary have been re-finished... and they look good. See the attached photo of them before the finish.

I hope that everyone is enjoying the online services. It is great that pastor can record his sermons, etc. at home and that we can record the Praise Band and put it all together. I hope

that it brings some comfort to all who watch them.

We have set up a park lot location at Tri Township Park for Drive-in services. We have planned our first date as June 28, 2020. This WILL BE WEATHER PERMITTING ONLY. More information to come.

FINANCIAL HEALTH

Note from the Treasurer

Just a note to let you all know that financially we are sound. At the end of month April our Operating fund has \$ 17432.32 . Our checkbook at Busey Bank has \$49,509.79. Last year at this time Operating fund had \$7313.46. Our checkbook at Busey Bank had \$7313.46. Our operating fund is not in the red so that is a good sign. That being said, we are not in church, we are not paying for a full-time minister, nor do we have a janitor at this time. We still must pay annual contracts, utility bills, and any maintenance that comes up, and any other bills deemed necessary by the boards. We still have some large bills to pay, \$10,000 for tuck pointing on the church, which will happen later. Also our heating system in main part of church broke and that will be patched up again. We don't have cost on that, but not too far down the road the heating system in sanctuary will have to be replaced, costing about \$30,000. The floors have been refinished, (they look really good) and the carpet is going to be cleaned. The cost of the flooring was \$4,669. which will come out of Capital Improvement. Just to let you know I have been coming in twice a week to sign checks, put checks in the computer system and balance the checkbook once a month. I have also been making the deposits. Monica gets the deposits ready and I check the figures just as a cross check. Sometimes Monica and I are there together, or she calls and lets me know when she has things ready to go and I go in later. As for as giving is concerned, some weeks we have small deposits and some weeks we have generous checks so our deposits are larger. I am not involved in the giving part of the computer process, Monica does that. As a church, we are all doing our best in donations and keeping up as best we can, we all have a lot to be grateful for.



"He has told you, O man, what is good, and what the LORD requires of you, except to do justice, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God."

(Micah 6: 8)



The writer of this scripture, the prophet Micah, was a prophet to the Southern Kingdom during a time in which they were held in captivity and their hearts were far from God.

There are three important things that God was calling them to:

- 1) To work for justice.....the relationship between people was not right and not the way that God intended. It had to be corrected.
- 2) To love mercy....this was a "heart-filled desire to do good to others and obey God"
- 3) To walk humbly with their God......This reminded them and us that God wants a relationship and not ritual or sacrifice. This idea of humbly walking means we must yield our will to God and remind ourselves that pride can be a block to our covenant with God and our neighbor.

The main idea is that God wants our hearts so that we may do His will and love and serve others.

This passage has always meant a lot to me. It accompanies a picture that my wife, Danielle and I had taken on our 10th anniversary. It reminds me of the covenant of love I have with her but also with God and others. I realize that just loving God or loving Danielle or loving my neighbor is not enough. I must follow that love with actions of justice, mercy and humility for the covenant to have meaning and integrity.

In the midst of the chaos of the pandemic and the fear and confusion of peaceful protests and violent riots, we pray that as a people of God, our actions will be always born out of love for God and one anotheractions of justice, mercy, and humility! We pray also for wisdom and courage to speak out boldly with truth and sincere compassion! We pray that God will take a hold of our hearts and use us for His will. For God has already told us what he requires if we love Him.

CROCKPOT CRACK CHICKEN RECIPE

INGREDIENTS

- 3 to 4 chicken breasts boneless, skinless
- 2 1-ounce packages ranch dressing mix
- 8 ounces cream cheese cut into cubes
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 pound bacon cooked and crumbled
- 2 cups Colby Cheddar cheese shredded
- 2 to 3 tablespoons green onions sliced (optional ingredient)
- 2 tablespoons jalapenos diced or 2 tablespoons of your favorite hot sauce (optional ingredient)

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Place chicken breasts in the slow cooker. Sprinkle ranch dressing and cream cheese over chicken.
