What does true freedom in Christ look like?

Galatians 5: 13 NIV

"You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love." ... Instead, use your freedom to serve one another in love."

As we move into the month of July and prepare to celebrate our Independence and freedom as a country from England so many years ago, I think it is helpful to reflect as a Body of Christ on what "true freedom in Christ" means.

Often, we believe that liberty means that you and I can do as we please, that we have rights to be defended and no one can demand that we give up those rights. Freedom of speech, protests, acts of defiance are the key pillars of our society and our greatest fear is their removal.

Christian scripture teaches us however, that the liberty we have in Christ is for a specific purpose, and not just to satisfy our own desires and wants, but to free us from sin, oppression, and anything that might separate us from God.

The writer, Amy Noel Green, says that our "transformation (into the image of God) is impossible without (this) liberty, **but it is not a liberty to stay as we are; it is a liberty to become what we should.** (So) Christian liberty does not herald our individualism. It is not concerned with offering us the 'freedom to be ourselves.' Instead, as we focus on the gifts that Christ's death and resurrection have purchased for us, that libertywill gradually make us less ourselves.....and more like the God we love and serve."

Paul, in Galatians 5, speaks of the freedom saying that "the only thing that matters is faith expressing itself through love. Later he suggests that if we live out this faith we will live by the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Maybe this year, instead of focusing so much on what our national freedom typically focuses on and what it guarantees, we would do well to spend more time living out the freedom in Christ in our nation and our world! Imagine how this would change our outlook on the circumstances and change our hearts and minds.

1. Suspended incoming donations. However, monetary donations are always accepted.

2. Suspended our normal distributions physically at the pantry.

3. Retained our inventory and proceeds for when we do resume normal operations. We anticipate serving those affected by COVID-19 over the long-term. Therefore, we made short-term decisions to ensure our effectiveness beyond the current crisis. We anticipate a robust need for MU into 2021.

4. Identified those we most recently assisted and resumed serving them in a creative manner.

5. MU is not in a position, at this time, to expand exponentially those we are serving.
