#### **Congregational Meeting.**

We are planning on having our congregational meeting on September 27<sup>th</sup> following our 10:00 AM service at the park. This is weather permitting. If the weather prevents us from having this meeting outside, then we will postpone by 1 week. This meeting date is earlier than normal, but we feel that the weather may not be as good in October.

#### **Board Nominations**

The council met on August 23<sup>rd</sup> and we are suggesting that for all board positions, that we maintain the status-quo for next year. This also includes the council. This will be presented to the congregation at the Congregational meeting.

#### 2021 Budget

We are starting to determine what our budget might look like for next year. The Council and Finance Board are planning on having their budget meeting on Sept 6<sup>th</sup>, and we hope to present this to the congregation at the congregation meeting on Sept 27<sup>th</sup>.

#### Choir, Sunday School, and other activities

Michael will be meeting with the choir members to determine if there is any way of safely having choir practice, or remote choir. More on this next month.

Stephanie is planning on having **Sunday School** outside at the park if possible. However, if Triad School District transitions to an "all remote" learning environment, then in-person Sunday School will most likely be halted. Stephanie is looking at alternative ways to engage our youth if that happens.

**Rally Day** for Sunday School is currently planned for Sept 13<sup>th</sup>. Regardless of what happens with our Sunday school program, Pastor Tim will conduct a "**Blessings of the Backpack**" service. I encourage all school goers, regardless of age, to bring your backpacks and attend this service.

#### **Closing notes:**

I want to thank everyone for your support of the church these past few months, not only financially, but also with your attendance, thoughts, and prayers. We have consistently had 50ish attendees at our park services, and it has been great to see everyone in person. We will continue these services as long as we can, until it becomes too cold to do so.

#### "Good Friends"

#### "What a friend we have in Jesus, all our sins and griefs to bear; and what a privilege to carry everything to God in prayer.... Can we find a friend so faithful, who will all our sorrows share? Jesus knows our every weakness, take it to the Lord in Prayer"

Recently, I had a conversation with my best friend whom I met in school well over 30 years ago. It reminded me of how important good friendships are with God, first and foremost; and with others secondarily. A true friend is a friend whether it is convenient or not and will consistently standby you both when you are present and when you are not. They're authentic and honest; not phony but show you who they really are.

Lynn Schroeder wrote an article on true friendship which offers traits of a good friend:

# **IMPORTANT** Information

We will not be having an opening gathering for Sunday School. All children are to go directly to their classrooms. EVERYONE will need to wear a mask, adults and children. If any of the below is an issue, we will ask you to return another day. These guidelines are what our school district is using. We will follow these guidelines as well to keep everyone safe:

<u>A temperature of 100 or higher will be considered a reason for the child or adult not to attend</u> <u>Sunday School or Worship.</u> <u>Congestion or runny nose, shortness of breath, fatigue, body ache,</u> <u>headache, new loss of taste or smell, diarrhea, nausea or vomiting, sore throat any of these are</u> <u>reasons not to attend Sunday School or Worship.</u>
