

#### A note from Pastor Tim

#### Answering our "Why?" Question!

I was reading an article about a preacher in Atlanta, several years ago, who noticed in the restaurant's section of the Yellow Pages, an entry for a place called "The Church of God Grill". The peculiar name aroused his curiosity, and he dialed the number. A man answered with a cheery, "Hello! Church of God Grill!"

The preacher asked how that restaurant had been given such an unusual name, and the man said: "Well, we had a little mission down here, and we started selling chicken dinners after church on Sunday to help pay the bills. Well, people liked the chicken, and we did such a good business, that eventually we cut back on the church service. After a while we just closed down the church altogether and kept on serving chicken dinners. We kept the name we started with, and that's "The Church of God Grill."

This is perhaps a humorous story but there is an uncomfortable truth underneath. Sometimes we can be so busy as a church, doing activities that we don't have time "to do ministry". Something seems to be wrong with this picture. It usually boils down to the fact that someone is failing to ask the "Why?" question. Why as a faith community are we choosing to do the activities we do? Are we ultimately building up the Kingdom of God or something else? As a faith community, what is our ultimate purpose and goal in honoring God and God's will?

Our programs and ministries can become sacred cows. Maybe they were once the pet project of a particular member or a group of members, alive or deceased. The thought of eliminating the non-functional ministry started by a charter member of our congregation years ago is unthinkable.

Even a good ministry may not be the best use of time for a church. Thought may not be given to whether there might be other ministries that could be more effective and more appropriately fit the mission and vision of the church. When we respond with "Silo behavior" among the different ministries of the church, we can hurt other ministries in the church and spread our volunteers too thin.

In the coming days, Friedens church leadership and its ministry teams will be reflecting on the important "Why" questions of our church and building budgets to accompany these goals. Questions like: Are we a facility-centered ministry only? Or do we consider ways to do ministry outside the walls of our church? What ways can we create a welcoming and hospitable environment so people will feel Christ's love and presence when they enter our building and encounter us? Are we willing to sacrifice our own "great ideas" for goals that will fit the overall mission and direction of our church? It takes courage for leaders to look at the busyness of a church and say "no" or "enough". It takes courage to move out of our comfort zones and trust in God's Spirit to lead us!

I know that we will be navigating these waters together in the coming days! I pray God continues to remain at the center of our "Why?" question in all we do and plan!
